When I was a child Perry Como sang a beautiful rendition of Bless this House that you can still hear on YouTube with Lyrics.

Bless this house, O Lord we pray, Make it safe by night and day. Bless these walls so firm and stout, Keeping want and trouble out. Bless the roof and chimneys tall, Let Thy peace lie overall. Bless this door that it may prove, ever open, to joy and love.

Bless these windows shining bright, letting in God's heavenly light. Bless the hearth, ablazing there, with smoke ascending like a prayer! Bless the folk that dwell within, keep them pure and free from sin Bless us all that we may be, fit O Lord to dwell with Thee, Bless us all that one day we may dwell O Lord with Thee!

I Love the idea of blessing our homes for the New Year. Some of us have new homes, some of us are in the same home, some are in a dorm room. Wherever we find ourselves this year, I will be passing out chalk again to mark the door post above, not unlike the way the Hebrews spread blood over the door to let the angel know it could Passover their home and spare their first born in Egypt long ago.

Exodus 12:1-13

The Epiphany blessing is in keeping with the Passover, written upon the lintel which is the top cross beam in the main doorway of your home. The chalking should look like this: 20 + C + M + B + 26

These are the initials of the three wisemen connected with crosses, with the year on either side. 20 is our millennium and century, the C stands for Caspar, the M for Melchior, the B for Balthasar and the 20 stands for the year or decade as it is this year. It also means in Latin, "Christus mansionem benedicat" (Christ bless this house.)

There are two prayers for this blessing. The first will be said by me at our worship service to set apart this chalk to this special use.

Bless O Lord this chalk, and let it be a help to humankind. Grant that those who will use it with faith in your holy name and with it inscribe on the doors of their homes the names of the wisemen, Casper, Melchior, and Balthasar, may enjoy health in body and protection of soul through Jesus Christ our Lord, Amen.

Then when you are marking or chalking your door's lintel, say this prayer:

Bless, O Lord God Almighty, this home, that in it there may be health, purity, the strength of victory, humility, goodness and mercy, the fulfillment of Your law, and continual thanksgiving to God the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit. And may this blessing remain upon this home and upon the hearts of all who dwell therein. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

May this new tradition bring Christ close in your home or apartment and make it a shelter from the storms of this life.




Wayne County Children and Youth Thank Bethany Presbyterian Church
