And the king and his men.... spoke to David, saying, "You shall not come in here: but the blind and the lame will repel you," .... Nevertheless, David took the stronghold of Zion (that is the City of David).

2 Samuel 5:6-9

"Nevertheless, David took the stronghold...."

Wouldn't you love God to write a nevertheless in your biography? Born to alcoholics, nevertheless, she lived a sober life. Never went to college, nevertheless, he mastered a trade. Didn't read the Bible until retirement age, nevertheless, she came to a deep abiding faith.

#### NOTES FROM THE SESSION



The Session has met throughout the summer, although it is not quite so busy a time for many. We have applied for grants through the Honesdale Ministerium for funds to replace our AEDs. You may have noticed that both units are beeping because of low batteries. We received one of the two grants we applied for in the amount of \$1000. In other business, we voted to send a donation to Samaritan's Purse to help the victims of the flash floods in Texas.

In July, we regretfully accepted the resignation of Judy Funk from the Session.

The merger of Lackawanna and Lehigh Presbyteries into the Mountain Laurel Presbytery is moving forward. It was approved by the General Assembly, and the next step is the approval of the corporation by the state of Pennsylvania. That is expected by November.

#### Kirk'n of the Tartans

We will have our special Kirk'n of the Tartan's Service on Reformation Sunday, October 26th. Our worship will actually fall on the real date of the Reformation start on October 31, 1517.

During the difficulty between Scotland and England the King of England did not want the northern neighbors gathering in groups to plan attacks. They saw the Tartan's, the family uniform of kilts and shawls in beautiful plaids, as a threat of imminent attack. So, the wearing of the family/clan tartans was outlawed. The local Kirk, Scottish for church, Presbyterian Kirk, still attempted to have a service to bless the families or clans each year.

Some were held on St. Andrew's Day and others on Reformation Sunday. The people very carefully brought small squares of their tartan to worship and laid them on the communion tables. There the Kirk Pastor was able to bless all of them at one time, much the way he would have blessed them wearing their clan colors. This year, we will once again be bringing something to represent our families or ourselves to be blessed in worship as the tartans were blessed long ago. Perhaps you have a tartan shawl or kilt? # **Building & Grounds Meeting Minutes July 24, 2025**

Attendees: Craig Olver (Chair) Mary Evans, Rev. Katie Hopper, Kevin Knapp, Yvonne Plastaras, Sally Rutherford and Linda Zimmer.

Rev. Katie opened the meeting with prayer.

The following old business was discussed:

Outside lighting project update: Craig gave a tour of the work that had been done installing the lighting at the barn. The biggest cost was to reconnect the underground conduit that had been installed years ago. The conduit had to be completed to the barn and to the Wilder House. Unfortunately, this is where most of the money went to upgrade the lighting at the barn. Craig explained to the group how the barn lighting would work. When people use the barn parking lot for an evening meeting at the Wilder House.

<u>National Register update:</u> Linda showed the committee the plaque that was presented to the church. Kevin volunteered to install the post and make a bracket to hold the plaque. It was discussed where the appropriate location for the plaque to be installed. It was unanimously decided that the best location would be at the bottom of the ramp behind the railing.

<u>AED. Update</u>: Yvonne gave a brief update to replace our 2 AED's. She noted that the battery and pads need to be replaced. We made a grant application with Presbytery to receive funding for the AEDs with training. Linda reported that the grant money can be used to replace the old pads and batteries in our AEDs.

<u>Fire extinguisher update.</u>: Craig said all the fire extinguishers were inspected. With some of them needing to be replaced. Mander Fire & Safety did the work.

<u>Vendor/password notebook</u>: The committee members had planned to create an information notebook of all the vendors/password that the church & Wilder House use. That way in the future this information could easily be obtained.

<u>Strawberry festival</u> was held Saturday June 21st. The Building & Grounds committee was asked to provide a tent, bring benches, set them up at the grandstand and for someone to assist with the overflow parking at our church parking lot. Pat and Yvonne <u>Plastaras</u> helped me set up the tent and benches in front of the pavilion bandstand the morning of the event. Volunteers from other organizations helped Craig with the overflow parking at our property. At one time the church parking lot was filled, and the barn parking lot was filled except for three parking spaces.

Yvonne and Pat Plastaras replaced 2 windowpanes in the lunch hallway at the Wilder House. They also repaired the loose bathroom sink in the upstairs bathroom at the Wilder House.

July 14th at 7:00 PM the Building & Grounds committee had a cell phone conference call to discuss the gas stove at the rental property. After a brief discussion it was decided that we should replace it, and Linda would investigate getting one that would fit the stove location at the rental property, remove the old one and install the new one.

Next Meeting: The meeting date of August 26, 2025, at 6pm in the church basement was scheduled.


