#### **Missions on the Move**

The Mission Committee is a very active group of church members always looking for ways to promote the Gospel, and our church, in both the local community and worldwide.

In May we were blessed with a presentation from our missionary in Africa, Jamie Lungu. She and her family have been in the United States on leave and will be returning to the Mission Field

soon. She and her husband work for Pioneer Bible Translators and we have supported them through the Mission Funds for several years. To better explain the program, as they did that Sunday, below is a statement from the website for Pioneer Bible Translators.

"Pioneer Bible Translators<sup>®</sup> bridges the gap between the church and the Bibleless peoples around the world. Our team is composed of Bible translators, literacy evangelists, church planters and a variety of support personnel working to see transformed lives through God's Word in every language. Pioneer Bible Translators is working in 29 countries in 115 languages that impact 188 million people."

Jamie is a sign language translator and works with

the deaf in Africa. It is reported by Pioneer Bible Translators that only 2% of the world's 70 million deaf people know God. What a mission this is!

Lorraine Gallik presented Jamie with our \$300.00 annual donation at that time.

In May we also began an outreach to the residents of Bethany Village Senior Living. A group from the church (including you if you are interested) go the Bethany Village on the fourth Thursday of each month at 1:30pm to sing familiar old-time hymns, read some scripture and have a short de-



votion. We usually have between 25 and 30 residents join us and it is amazing to hear their voices lifted in praise to the Lord. It brings as much joy to our hearts as it does to the residents. Sue Seber is our fellowship leader and Helen Ward is our pianist. One of the residents, Frank Boast, brings along his harmonica to join Helen in accompanying the singing. Please join us if you are available.

This activity led us to extend an invitation to the Activities Director, Kim Erikson, to bring some of the residents to church on Sunday morning in the 16 passenger bus they own. So, on a Sunday morning in June, we were joined by 14 residents and Kim at our Worship Service. Due to previ-

ous commitments, they were unable to come in July, but are planning on coming again in August. What a joy to have them filling up some pews!

### DYBERRY DAY CAMP

Located near the Wayne County Fairgrounds, Dyberry Day Camp (DDC) celebrated its 51st year this year.

DDC runs in the month of July and hosts 36 children with intellectual or developmental disabilities from Wayne and Pike Counties. There is no cost to the camper and free transportation is provided. The camp is sponsored by The ARC of Wayne County and is primarily funded through the generous efforts of the students at local school districts during activities like the Bike Hike or the Wallenpaupack Area Color Run.

The camp has grown over the years. In 1972, it started out with about a dozen campers, a tarp for coverage, one outhouse, one shed, and a sand pile. Children had to walk or be pushed, if the child was in wheelchair, to a swimming hole in Dyberry Creek. Through community donations of time, talents,



camp now contains a swing set, a playground, a large permanent pavilion, many port-a-potties, changing rooms, and storage shed. Campers are transported by bus to the Honesdale pool each day.

This year, Ron Lawrence and his brother, Keith, volunteered their time and donated materials and installed a new gate post. Ron also sprayed a storage shed because porcupines had been chewing on it.

Starting about two decades ago, the Bethany Presbyterian Church has been blessed to visit these campers. On July 11th, Terry Lawrence led a sing-along for the campers using handson objects and body movements. We were pleased to see four

of our young church members working at the camp as counselors; they were Seth, Kyler, Emily, and Katie Gunuskey.

Dave Seber made a guest appearance as Barney. He gave joy to the children even though he wore a mask in the heat, and he couldn't see to walk! What a guy!

After that, Ice Cream Cottage's sundaes were served by our members. Thanks to those who showed God's love by helping; they were Linda Stiles, Joan Green, Susan Darville, Dave and Sue Seber, and Ron and Terry Lawrence. And thanks to those who donate money to the church so we can do this type of outreach.

We remember Luke 14:12-14 *Then Jesus said to his host, 'When you give a luncheon or a dinner, do not invite your* 



friends or your brothers or your relatives or rich neighbors, in case they may invite you in return, and you would be repaid. But when you give a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind. And you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you, for you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous.'





## Update from the Pastor Nominating Committee

As our journey began looking for a pastor, the PNC, Pastor Nominating Committee, received information from a Presbytery representative, Rev. Brague, who has worked with other churches seeking pastors. He stated that local churches have taken an average of 12 to 18 months to find a pastor and that each church reviewed approximately 150 PIF, Pastor Information Forms. We hoped that would not be the case for us, but as we all know, God is in control, and everything will happen on his timeline, not on ours. We remember <u>Psalm 130:5</u> "I wait for the LORD, my soul does wait, And in His word do I hope."

### **MISSION INFORMATION FORM**

The PNC, Pastor Nominating Committee, compiled information from the church's Mission Study Report to complete the MIF, Mission Information Form. Our Mission Study Report contains our church's goals and mission statements. (The Mission Study Report can be found on our church's website.) Also, the MIF needed basics about the church, pastor's salary, housing, etc. The PNC had to fill out narrative questions about the church's visions and mission goals. Another segment of the form had 33 characteristics of a pastor (called leadership competencies), and the committee had to choose what they felt were the top ten skills or competencies a pastor should have that would be most beneficial to the Bethany Presbyterian Church. This information was extremely important because it was one way, later in the process, the PNC's top ten characteristics would be matched up with the top ten characteristics of pastors' responses. Then the completed form was sent to the session for review. Slight changes were made.

Next, the form went to the Presbytery to COM, Committee on Ministry, to review. The PNC heard the COM didn't usually approve the information the first time, but praise God, it was approved. Once completed, the Mission Information Form went to the CLC, Church Leadership Connection, in Lewisburg, KY to be placed online where Presbyterian churches USA pastors viewed it. The system then matched the information the PNC gave to the ones the pastor's filled out on his/her PIF, Pastor Information Forms.

Some possible candidates from Lewisburg were received. The PNC checked to see if the pastor's leadership competencies matched with ours. Based on their responses, there were a few pastors the PNC looked at as possible candidates, but after reviewing the PIFs, Pastor Information Forms, they felt those pastors would not be a good fit for our church.

## UPDATES AND OUTREACH

- To reach out to more people, our minister's job description was placed on our Facebook Page and church's website.
- The search was widened by sending our Minister's Job Descriptions to Presbyterian, Evangelical Lutheran, and United Church of Christ seminaries.
- Letters will be sent to Presbyterians in other states.

## A HICCUP IN THE PROCESS

The PNC recently received a letter stating that the original MIF (Ministry Information Form) that they had laboriously filled out, had been changed to a different form called the MDP (Ministry Discernment Profile). This required the PNC to make adjustments on narrative questions they originally worked so hard on, and the 33 leadership competencies were gone and replaced with trait descriptions which required re-evaluation also. The PNC recently had a zoom meeting with knowledgeable people on how to fill out the new form. The completed form will once again be sent to session for approval and then to Presbytery's COM the first week in August. We will continue to update you on our progress.

As we go through this period of time seeking a pastor, remember to:

- $\Rightarrow$  Trust in God's Timing, because God has a time and a season for everything (Ecclesiastes 3:1)
- ⇒ Keep believing that God knows what is best for us and that He will answer our prayers in His own Timing, His own way according to His wisdom.
- $\Rightarrow$  Keep Praying and thanking God for His goodness, mercy, and grace.
- $\Rightarrow$  Keep believing in the promises of God for us which are all Yes and Amen in Christ (2 Corinthians 1:20)
- $\Rightarrow$  Be patient.
- $\Rightarrow$  Watch for His answers.
- $\Rightarrow$  Keep fixing our eyes on Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith (Hebrews 12:2).
- $\Rightarrow$  Trust in His unfailing Love
- $\Rightarrow$  Remember that He has not forgotten about our prayers, about us.
- ⇒ Remember that we are not alone but that God is with us and that He will never leave nor forsake us.
- $\Rightarrow$  Believe that God will give us the strength we need while we are waiting on His timing. He will renew our strength. (Isaiah 40:31)
- $\Rightarrow$  Remember that God is faithful. (2 Timothy 2:13)
