
Session Notes

January's PNC (Pastor Nominating Committee) Update

Happy New Year! The committee is excited to report great things have already happened since the members were elected only a few months ago. The PNC has worked hard on the MIF (Ministry Information Form) and it is complete. This form contains detailed information on what types of things, we as a congregation, are seeking in a new Pastor. You will remember that we began the work of hearing where God is leading us in the Mission Study Report completed early last year. This document, your comments, and the congregational meeting gave us great guidance in how to draft the Ministry Information Form.

The MIF was presented to Session and they provided their guidance. They set the maximum salary we will offer our new pastor and made some additional suggestions. The PNC then made those changes, Session again reviewed it and approved the MIF on January 7, 2023. Thank you, Session, for your input. Then it was on to the Presbytery's Committee On Ministry. On January 12, 2023 the COM accepted the MIF and gave us the green light to go ahead. We now begin the process of entering the MIF into the National PCUSA database where Pastors all over the country can review it and apply. In case a Pastor misses us, the computer also picks its matches. Now comes the real work of reviewing and evaluating the candidates. We will keep you posted as things move along.

We would like to take a minute to thank everyone for the many prayers. They have been felt. We believe with your prayers, God's word, and carefully listening for God's voice we will be able to find the right Pastor to shepherd Bethany.

Peanut Butter Bars

If you like peanut butter, this is for you!!! So Good!!!

Base:

1/3 c. butter flavor Crisco 1 1/2 tsp. baking powder

1/2 c. creamy peanut butter 1/2 tsp. salt 1/2 c. packed brown sugar 1/4 c. milk 2 eggs 1/4 c. milk 1 tsp. vanilla

1 1/2 c. flour

Heat oven to 350. Grease 15x10x1 inch baking pan. For base, cream together Crisco & peanut butter, blend in brown sugar & eggs. Mix rest of ingredients at low speed until blended. Spread batter in pan. Bake for 18-20 min. Cool

Frosting: Cream 1/4 c butter flavor Crisco, 2/3 c. creamy peanut butter, 4 c. powdered sugar, 1/2 c. milk, beat until fluffy. Spread on cooled cookie base.

For Drizzle: Melt chocolate. From end of spoon drizzle back and forth over frosting. Cut in 2 inch squares. Refrigerate 15-20 min. until chocolate is firm (3 dozen)


BATS AROUND THE HOME

Bats are extremely important. Yet due to years of unwarranted human fear and persecution, bats are in alarming decline. Bats are the only mammals that fly. Their wings are thin membranes of skin stretched from fore to hind legs, and from hind legs to tail. The name of their order, Chiroptera, means "hand-winged." Their long, slender finger bones act as wing struts, stretching the skin taut for flying: closed, they fold the wings alongside the body. They maneuver with pinpoint precision through the nighttime sky and home-in on flying insects with deadly accuracy. Bats will not interfere with feeding backyard birds, and pets or children will not disrupt them. As the primary predators of night-flying insects, bats play a vital role in maintaining the balance of nature. And, as consumers of vast numbers of pests, they rank among humanity's most valuable allies. A single little brown bat can catch hundreds of mosquito-sized insects an hour, and a typical colony of big brown bats can protect local farmers from the costly attacks of 18 million root-worms each summer.

- You have a higher chance of winning your state lottery that being bitten by a bat with rabies.
- ♦ Bats are very advantageous in this way, one bat can eat roughly 600-1,000 mosquitoes and other insect pests each HOUR in our backyard.
- Past research indicates that the actual incidence of rabies in bat populations is less than 0.5% in most areas.
- Bats are not blind.
- Are actually very clean animals.
- They do not get caught in peoples' hair or chew through the attic of your house.
