Christmas

Dr. Katie "Christmas" comes from two words – *Christ* and *mass*, or *Christmass. Christ* is derived from the Greek word *Christos*, which means *anoint*-

ed, and refers to the long awaited Messiah whom the Jews believed would be a divine, imperial king who would rule the world. This person turned out to be the only perfect Son of God, the anointed of the Lord.

The word *mass*, in the religious sense, means *to send* or *dismiss*. It has been used for centuries by much of the church to designate worship or the celebration of worship.

Therefore, the word *Christmas* indicates the *worship of the Lord's Anointed One*, or the *celebration of the Lord's Anointed*.

What makes Christmas "happen" for you? Where does the joy of the season or passion come alive in you? Is it in the carols? The celebrations? The candlelight service? The food? Perhaps you find it in the shopping and gift-giving. Maybe you see the love of the season in the sparkling eyes of a child or feel it in a loved one's hug.

Whatever it is, during this holiday season with all its frenzied festivities, stop and remember that night in the stable, those mingled smells of animals and hay, that pain and subsequent joy in the birth of one small child. Breathe deep and feel with Mary, with Joseph, the shepherds, the angels. Feel the birth of Jesus. What is it to experience such joy, such peace? Verbally express to someone close to you what the birth of Christ means to you at this point in your life. Be joyful! Experience God's love and peace.

ion of the Saints. To the widow or widower or even the loving daughter or son, this is so special.

If you want to see a vivid illustration of this doctrine, rent the movie Places in the Heart. It closes with a communion service where all the people who have died in the movie suddenly appear next to the living passing and taking communion. On All Saints Day we celebrate this reality and the "balcony people of heaven" are in attendance. Come join us and remember those who once sat around you and are dear to your heart. I know you still see them and long to hold them again. As they pass the baton of faith to each of us we dedicate our pledges in worship and take up that baton to carry it into 2025.

Blue Christmas Service December 19 at 7:00 PM

This year we will host our first annual Blue Christmas Service for the whole community. It is held near the longest night of the year, so on December 19th at 7:00 p.m., we will gather in the sanctu-



ary, decorated in blue, with candles to light in memory of loved ones lost to us but in heaven now.

There are many kinds of loss that are experienced in this life: jobs, family, friends, good health are just a few examples. Many find that the Christmas season is not a happy one for them, and they are uncomfortable with all the joyful and "ho, ho, ho" kinds of observances.

This service is sponsored by our Stephen Ministry and our church, which care deeply for the real needs and feelings

of people. It is designed to allow folks to lean into their grief or disappointments by drawing closer to the Savior, who was acquainted with grief and sorrow. Come and be comforted by this loving service. Invite someone you know is hurting this holy season. There will be opportunities to be anointed in prayer by a Stephen Minister, light a candle of remembrance, place a note in the manger to Baby Jesus, and spend time in prayer and soak up the love and comfort of our Savior and our church family.

Praise and Thanks Sunday and Christ the King Sunday fall together this year

Christ the King Sunday is when we remember, just before Advent starts that the baby that will come is really the King of the Universe, our Lord and Savior, Jesus the Christ. It is the final Sunday in the liturgical church year. It is meant to remind us that the work of Christ is complete and He is seated now on the right hand of the Father. It is also a time for us to remember that a Second Advent will come and Christ will return to take us home. On really bad days I always pray with John from Revelation, " E'n so Lord Jesus, quickly come again, and night will be no more. We need no light, nor lamp, nor sun, for Christ shall be our all."

For now we celebrate his Kingship, his completion of our forgiveness of sins with his sacrifice on the cross, and his return for us. Try not to fast forward to Advent, until you have worshipped the King on November 24th.

Advent Wreath. I remember as a child being fascinated with the lighting of the Advent Candles of Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love. It was so much fun when our family volunteered to take one of the Sundays.



I still remember my father's deep bass voice as he read the passage of scripture and gave my mother the prayer. My sister and I were allowed to help light the candle for that week.

Make this a special part of your celebration of Advent and preparation for the coming of the Christ Child.

MISSION COMMITTEE UPDATES

The Mission Committee continues to provide assistance to those in need in the local area and around the world. We have had a busy year working to meet the needs of those during a crisis or financial hardship. We have been blessed by large gifts to the fund this year from people outside of the congregation who have heard of our work. The Lord continues to provide as we work to care for the needy.

Local Assistance: This year we gave donations to two families who had lost everything they owned in house fires. We also sent assistance to two families devastated by the loss of the father, when each was killed in a car accident. People also received help with fuel oil or other financial assistance. We also continue to support the local food pantries, the fire companies, Dyberry Day Camp, the Salvation Army, the Children's Christmas Bureau, Bethany 4-H and VIP with budgeted monies.

Christmas in July! The Operation Christmas Child Shoebox collection was held and we have 24 boxes ready to send when the collection period opens in November. (There are still shoeboxes available if you would like to fill one or more.) Thank you to everyone who participated in this program for Samaritan's Purse. Someone mentioned that they didn't really know what Samaritan's Purse was all about. The following is the answer they give to that question on their website. "After sharing the story of the Good Samaritan, Jesus said "Go and do likewise." That is the mission of Samaritan's Purse—to follow the example of Christ by helping those in need and proclaiming the hope of the Gospel." They have an incredible response time to disasters all around the globe and are headquartered in Boone, NC. There are several people in the Honesdale area who have responded to their call for volunteers and have served with them following hurricanes in Florida and Texas. We will find out some specific items that are needed and pass this information along to you. The Committee also will be creating something special for each one of the residents. We continue to visit and sing hymns once a month at Bethany Village and we have added a monthly visit to sing with the residents at Ellen Memorial. This summer we also spent an afternoon at Bethany Village with a "beach themed" VBS for the residents. What a blessing for the residents AND for us.

Church Library! The library bookcase has arrived and we will be ready for donations to our Christian Book Library starting the first Sunday in November. It is located in the Blanche Heller Room in the Wilder House. Please feel free to browse and borrow any books that interest you. There is no time limit for use and feel free to share books with friends as you wish.

Missionary Support! We continue to support global missions through Mike and Jamie Lungu who work with Pioneer Bible Translators in Africa. Their letters can be found on the bulletin board in the Ladies Parlor. Please listen to the announcements for our next meeting and join us if you feel the urge to do Mission work.
