New AEDs for the Church and Wilder House

At a recently called Session meeting, it was discussed that our AEDs in both buildings have batteries and pads that have expired. The decision was made to purchase new AEDs from Stephens Pharmacy at a cost of \$1695 for each unit.

Grants are available from the Honesdale Ministerium for up to \$1000 for each unit. We have applied for two grants, one per building. As the church funds are extremely tight at this time, the Building and Grounds Committee, together with the Finance Committee, invite anyone who would like to support the purchase of the new AEDs to make a donation earmarked for this purchase and place it in the offering plate. If donations exceed the purchase of the 2 AEDs, this money will be put aside for upgrading of the church's outside lighting.

NOTES FROM THE SESSION

At our April meeting, we accepted two resignations from Session: Terry Lawrence and Mark Bartocci. We also ordered a Baptism for worship on June 1 for Christopher Heckler. In addition, June 1 was our day to honor our graduates. Since these events happened on the first Sunday of June, communion for the month was moved to June 8, which was also Pentecost.

A motion was passed to use memorial funds to order a sign commemorating our designation on the National Register of Historic Sites. Look for the sign to be posted at the bottom of the ramp near our time capsule.

Due to scheduling conflicts, there was no Session meeting in May, but the June meeting will take place on June 8. Father's Day gifts will be passed out on June 15 in honor of all our fathers. An outdoor service with communion by intinction is scheduled for June 29, followed by a potluck picnic lunch.

At a called Session meeting, the decision was made to withdraw \$10,000 from our Money Market account in order to cover our monthly bills. Unfortunately, this means that we are currently running at a deficit. Our income per month is less than our expenses. Running our church is expensive, and we are grateful for the congregation's support, but we are currently in a difficult financial position.

Notes from the Mission Committee

The Mission Committee continues to share God's love through programs within the community and beyond. We are a very present and important part of the life of the residents of Bethany Village Senior Living Community and the Ellen Memorial Nursing Home. Our monthly visits to those facilities bring joy to all who join us, as we give them a connection to hymns and Bible readings that were so familiar to them throughout their lives. Those of us who participate from the church are also affected each month as we share with them. We hope to be able to become involved with the residents of Wayne Woodlands in the future.

Pastor Katie has Weis gift cards available from the Mission Fund to give to those people she sees who are in need. If you know of someone in need of assistance with food, please do not hesitate to speak with Pastor Katie.

Another program which we are exploring is a once a month food bank on a Saturday morning. This would be coordinated with the churches in town. Prepackaged food boxes are distributed from the food pantry.

Looking ahead, in July we are planning to provide an ice cream party at Bethany Village, in August we will do another Senior VBS and in October pumpkin painting. We will then provide Christmas gifts for the residents in December. We will also be participating in the Samaritan's Purse "Operation Christmas Child" shoebox program. The shoeboxes will be distributed in July, collected in August and stored until being shipped in November. We realize how busy everyone gets around the holidays, so we like to do this collection early and have it completed. More information will be forthcoming. We are also checking with the Senior Center to see if there are seniors in need of assistance of any kind. The Mission Committee meets monthly on the third Wednesday at 1PM. Please feel free to give us ideas or come join us at a meeting. We are always looking for ways to spread God's Word in the world and make our congregation a place where people can come and rejoice in the goodness of our Lord.
