Dear Church Family,

Today we are looking at Psalm 42:5 – "Why, my soul, are you downcast? Why so disturbed within me? Put your hope in God, for I will yet praise Him, my Savior and my God." The writer of Psalm 42 was discouraged. The struggles of life threatened to pull him under and take another victory. #### The Nomination of Bethany Presbyterian Church Has Been Approved to the National Register of Historic Places

On Tuesday, February 6, The Pennsylvania State Historic Preservation Office met to consider the nomination of our church to the National Register of Historic Places. After review of the nomination, the PSHPO unanimously approved our nomination. Sally Rutherford attended this meeting virtually to answer any questions regarding the church's history.

This was the culmination of a year of research, photography, and writing to prepare the nomination form. On December 7, two representatives from the PSHPO in Harrisburg visited the church and toured the building with Sally Rutherford and Linda Zimmer.

The National Register of Historic Places was established in 1966 to help coordinate and support private efforts to identify, evaluate, and protect our historic and archeological resources. During the meeting, the historic significance of our church and the National Register criteria for listing were discussed. Listing provides recognition of a property's historic importance and assures review of federally funded or permitted projects that might affect the historic character of the property. Listing in the National register does not mean that limitations will be placed on properties by the federal government.

Now that our nomination has been approved, the PSHPO is now preparing it for submission to the National Register staff in Washington, DC. We will be notified once that decision is made.

#### **News From Mission Committee**

Greetings from the mission committee. Since the last newsletter the Bethany congregation has been very busy showing God's love to our friends at Bethany Village. Christmas morning each resident, fifty-five in total, received a gift from our church. Valentines Day was no different and we supplied chocolate gift boxes for everyone. (Photos below) We are so fortunate to have the resources and your support to provide these things. Thank you.

God has already blessed our mission work this year. Through the generosity of two anonymous donors the church has received \$8,000 specifically for missions. We can't thank them enough for their kind support and will seek Gods guidance on how to best use these funds.

So far, we have already been able to help five families in our community. January brought cold weather to the area, and we were able to provide for two families heating needs (\$800). Sadly, two other families lost everything to house fires and another two young families lost their husband/father. We donated funds to help with their financial needs (\$2,000). Our prayers go out to all these families. If you know someone who is struggling to pay for heating or food, please let one of the committee members know. We will do our best to help. No one should go hungry or cold.

In February we participated in a national program the "Souper Bowl of Caring". We collected 65 food items and one hundred and fifty dollars which was distributed to the Honesdale Emergency Pantry. If you missed the deadline to donate, no worries there is always a food collection box in the lady's parlor for donations. Lord knows there is much need.

We are always looking for ideas on how we reach out in love to our community or members of the congregation. If you have an idea, big or small, please let us know. If you feel moved to help, please join us. What an exciting time for Bethany. We are lucky to be welcoming pastor Katie and her contagious passion for missions and can't wait to hear her new ideas. Who knows where God will lead us next!

A light luncheon was provided from 2:00 to 4:00 pm at the Wilder house. This was a great opportunity for our church family and over 34 people stopped by. A special thank you to Joan Green who on behalf of the session headed the event.



Then on Sunday, January the 21<sup>st</sup>, Reverend Katie conducted the church service giving us all a chance to know her better. Her sermon on the Ebenezer Stone, with congregational gifts, was truly inspiring. The congregation was challenged to select an



Epiphany Star which contained a written word for us to consider throughout the week. Following the church service a congregational meeting was held to approve Reverand Katie and the terms of call. Ballots, PNC informational handouts, and the terms of call worksheet were provided prior to the meeting for congregational review. The terms of call outline the pastor's compensation package. Reverend Samford called the meeting to order and opened with prayer. The members of the PNC took a moment to express their personal feelings as to why they felt Reverand Katie would be a good spiritual leader for the church. A vote was taken and tallied. We are excited to report that out of all active members present there was only one

"no" vote. God is good. Linda Zimmer then escorted Reverend Katie back into the church where she was welcomed with a joyous round of applause. We are all excited to welcome Reverand Katie and pastor Jimmy into our church family.





#### **The Chosen Series**

The Chosen is a historical drama based on the life of Jesus Christ, seen through the eyes of those who knew him. Set



against the backdrop of Roman oppression in first-century Israel, this seven-season show shares an authentic intimate look at Jesus' revolutionary life and teachings. The series primarily focuses on Jesus and the different people who met, followed, or otherwise interacted with him.

The show's unique approach diverges from previous portrayals of Jesus. Rather than solely emphasizing Jesus himself, it crafts a compelling story arc centered around the individuals who encountered him.

The series The Chosen, was created by Dallas Jenkins (son of Left

Behind co-author Jerry Jenkins). His goal for the television series, The Chosen, was to help people know Jesus better and love Scripture more. To reach that goal, he and the other scriptwriters took the gospel accounts and added what are, in their opinion, plausible details about the lives of the biblical figures found there. They added backstories or dialog to well-known characters and fleshed out other characters who might receive only a passing mention in Scripture. Some locations and timelines have been combined or condensed. The intended result is that viewers see the people in the Bible as real people who dealt with the same types of issues, we all have to deal with. In The Chosen, the disciples have families and friends, they have reputations to uphold, they have a sense of humor, and they struggle with finances and other concerns.

Jenkins has a degree in Biblical Studies. In creating the show, Jenkins put together a panel of expert consultants to ensure biblical and historical accuracy in the script he was co-writing for the show. On the panel were a Messianic Jewish rabbi, a Catholic priest, and an evangelical professor of biblical studies.

As with all storytelling based on historical events, some artistic license is evident. In retelling the gospel accounts, the writers have inserted or modified some characters, storylines, and details of the inspired original. The changes are designed to give each episode a feeling of being grounded in real life. No one is claiming that the show is God's Word or that it is on par with the Bible. As long as viewers remember that what they are seeing is art and not real life—and they compare what they view with Scripture—there is no danger of confusion. We should all know intuitively that, for all its historical accuracy and attention to cultural context, The Chosen is simply one idea from one group of people about what they think it might have been like to be near Jesus.

Dramatizations of biblical events such as are presented in The Chosen provide an opportunity for sharing the gospel with those who otherwise might not be exposed to the Bible. For believers, such dramatizations can promote spiritual growth, reminding us that the Bible is more than just a story—it relates actual events in the lives of real people who had emotions, relationships, and concerns similar to ours.

#### The Chosen Marathon

Last year, the Fellowship Committee showed three episodes of Season One of the television series, *The Chosen*, in the sanctuary. The shows were well attended, and people voted to continue watching the series on Wednesday nights until all eight episodes of Season One were completed.

This year, we'd like to try a Saturday viewing of Season Two of *The Chosen* on Saturday, April 27<sup>th</sup> at 4:00 PM. Season two has eight episodes totaling about 400 minutes. The Fellowship Committee thought we could have a "series mara-thon", where we will watch an episode and have an appetizer. Then watch a couple more episodes and have supper and then a couple more episodes and have a dessert. Depending on how many sign up, we can either have it at a home or have it in the conference room of the Wilder House. We ask everyone bring a dish to share. Contact anyone on the Fellowship Committee with any questions or suggestions you may have.

**Faith and Denominational Background:** Life-long mainline Presbyterian; baptized December 16, 1960, by Presbyterian Air Force Chaplain Si Scott at the base chapel in Evreux, France. Grandmothers grew up in Third Presbyterian in New Orleans. My parents joined a Presbyterian church shortly after each Air Force move. Our family belonged churches in Columbus, OH; Lompoc ,Calif.; Topeka, KS – where I was in my first choir at 8; Belleville, IL – where I went on my first youth retreat; Ocean Springs, MS – where I was confirmed at the Christmas Eve Service in 1973; served as a youth on the Nominating Committee and was taken to the Montreat Youth Conference where God called me into the ministry; and University Pres. in Baton Rouge, LA where I was a Candidate for the Ministry and in the Choir. My parents also kept in contact with Col. Si Scott and brought him to serve on my ordination commission.

**Discerned Call to Ministry:** At Montreat Youth Conference 1976 after a powerful communion service, as I sang through the Hymnbook alone on the balcony of Assembly Inn, I felt called. I was 15.
