Dr. Katie As our nation struggles between to very polarized groups of leaders, many have become concerned and worried. Karl Barth, one of my favorite theologians wrote, "The Easter message tells us that our enemies, sin, the curse, and death, are beaten. Ultimately, they can no longer start mischief. They still misbehave as though the game were not decided, the battle not fought; we must still reckon with them, but fundamentally we must cease to fear them anymore." This is the kind of courage reflected in one of my favorite Easter stories.

In about 1930, the Communist leader Bukharin journeyed from Moscow to Kiev. His mission was to address a huge assembly. His subject was atheism. For a solid hour he aimed his heavy artillery at Christianity, hurling argument and ridicule. At last, he was finished and viewed what seemed to be the smoldering ashes of men's faith before him. "Are there any questions?" Bukharin demanded. A solitary man arose and asked permission to speak. He mounted the platform and moved close to the Communist. The audience was breathlessly silent as the man surveyed them first to the right, then to the left. At last, he shouted the ancient Orthodox greeting, "CHRIST IS RISEN!" The vast assembly arose as like one and the response came crashing like the sound of an avalanche, "HE IS RISEN INDEED!" Nothing can change this truth. God is still in charge. Thank the Lord!!

Maundy Thursday Communion/Tenebrae Service

We will gather at 7:00 p.m. to observe this Holy night that remembers the institution of the Lord's Supper by Jesus as he prepared to go to the cross. We will also remember his words from the cross with a selection of powerful readings by our Session Elders. This portion of the service is also known as a Tenebrae, or ser-

vice of darkness. As we progress through the last sayings of Christ from the cross from scripture, the candles will be extinguished one by one until with Christ's final words, the lights are turned off and the chancel area stripped of cloths and decorative items and then the lights and the last candle, The Christ Candle, will be extinguished. And then as we remember Christ's death, we will hear the haunting and beautiful presentation of Were You There? sung beautifully by Tim. When Pastor Katie relights the Christ candle to foreshadow the resurrection, we will depart in silence and wonder.

He turned water into wine so the host, who ran out of wine would not have to stop the party. This year we are going to try something new for the Sunday after Easter. We are going to have a Holy Humor Sunday!

Churches resurrect an old Easter custom (and so will we!)

Many American churches are resurrecting an old Easter custom begun by the Greeks in the early centuries of Christianity-"Holy Humor Sunday" celebrations of Jesus' resurrection on the Sunday after Easter. For centuries in Eastern Orthodox, Catholic and Protestant countries, the week following Easter Sunday, including "Bright Sunday" (the Sunday after Easter), was observed by the faithful as "days of joy and laughter" with parties and picnics to celebrate Jesus' resurrection. Churchgoers and pastors played practical jokes on each other, drenched each other with water, told jokes, sang, and danced.

Can you see us dancing to the hymn, "Lord of the Dance"? We can sing Amazing Grace to the tune of "Puff the Magic Dragon." And so many other fun worship experiences.

The custom of Holy Humor Sunday is rooted in the musings of early church theologians (like Augustine, Gregory of Nyssa, and John Chrysostom) that God played a practical joke on the devil by raising Jesus from the dead. (I loved it when Easter fell on April Fools Day). "*Risus paschalis* - the Easter laugh," the early theologians called it.
