What is found below is entitled "True Story." I cannot find an author. It's one of those writings FROM THE that someone sent me via the internet who got it from someone else via the internet!

His name was Fleming, and he was a poor Scottish farmer. One day while trying to eke out a living for his family, he heard a cry for help coming from a nearby bog. He dropped his tools and ran Dr. Katie to the bog. There, mired to the waist in black muck, was a terrified boy, screaming and struggling to free himself.

Farmer Fleming saved the boy from what could have been a slow and terrifying death. And the next day, a fancy carriage pulled up to the farmer's sparse surroundings. And that's just what happened! In time Farmer Fleming's son graduated from St. Mary's Hospital Medical School in London, and went on to become known throughout the world as the noted Sir Alexander Fleming, the discoverer of Penicillin.

Years later, the nobleman's son was again in peril – this time from pneumonia. What saved his life? Penicillin! The name of the nobleman whose son Farmer Fleming saved – Lord Randolph Churchill; and the name of Lord Randolph's son? - Sir Winston Churchill.

It has been said through the years that what goes around comes around. This story is a great example – Farmer Fleming did what he had to do to save a young boy named Winston Churchill. The nobleman and father, Lord Randolph Churchill, said thank you to Farmer Fleming by giving his own son an education. And year's later, Winston Churchill's life was again saved, this time by Farmer Fleming's son – Sir Alexander Fleming – through his efforts and research with penicillin. For Mother's Day from Pastor Katie with Love = A Mother's Prayers

Dr. McCosh, long ago president of Princeton had the custom of praying with members of his senior class before He told them goodbye, blessing them as they went into the world.

One day he asked a certain young man to kneel and pray with him, the man responded that he did not believe in God and did not believe in prayer. Hurt and astonished, the president shook hands with him and said, goodbye.

Some years later, Dr. McCosh was delivering a course of lectures in Ohio. Before going to the lecture hall, he was sitting in the lobby of his hotel. A man came to him and sat down beside him and said, "What is this, Dr. McCosh, I hear you are turning out infidels at Princeton? Surprised, Dr. McCosh asked him what he meant? The man then gave the history of the student who hand once refused to pray. It seems he had advanced to an important post in the schools of Cincinnati and that everywhere he went he was sowing seeds of unbelief and infidelity. But the man added, "He has a godly, praying mother, and I believe that in the end, she will win."

A year or two later Dr. McCosh was in his study at Princeton when a young man appeared with his young wife. He said to Dr. McCosh: "You would not remember me, but I am the student who refused to let you pray with him. I thought that I was an unbeliever, and wherever I could I sowed seeds of unbelief; but all that time my mother was praying for me. Her prayers have won. I am here at Princeton to enter the theological seminary, and before I go, I want you to kneel down with me and offer that long postponed prayer."

My dear and precious church family and friends never underestimate the prayers of a godly mother. If you are a mother be one and pray for your children. If you are a child with a mother still living love her and listen to what she prays for in, you and in your life.
